About

At Koba is a capitalis monumentalis typeface engraved in the fashion of the Basque Country. Koba (meaning “cave” in Basque / Euskera) is a font born in the wild, brought to a new digital era by the hand of a calligrapher.

The font includes plenty of alternates and ligatures, paying homage to the ancient monograms and letterings found in cemeteries and house fronts in the Basque Pyrenees.

At Koba presents a solid yet elegant design brimming with flavour, making it a new classic choice for contemporary branding and sharp packaging.

Desktop installation guide

On a Mac

To activate a font, simply drag the font files into the Fonts folder, which is located inside the Library folder here: `Macintosh HD > Library > Fonts`
Alternatively you can install the fonts with Font Book, a free application with macOS. More information, on the support section of the Apple website.

On a PC

Right-click the font files and select “Install” from the drop-down menu. In order to access the newly installed fonts, you have to re-start any application you have been using. Note that this “Install” function will create a copy of the selected fonts in the system’s “Fonts” folder.

Web usage guide

CSS @font-face

Upload .woff and .woff2 web fonts to your web server. Copy the code snippet example below into your CSS file to address your web fonts. Replace the example file URL with the appropriate path to the font files on your server.

HTML embed

You can reference your font family in CSS font stacks by the name you gave it, in the same way you would for a system font.
